WONDERFUL CROP IN S. DAKOTA

Hailstorms in Scattered Localities—Early Threshing Returns at Yankton.

Winona, Minn., July 25.—Crop conditions are being very closely watched. The frequent rains are not desired by the farmers, but it is not believed they will do any great damage except in scattered localities.

South Dakota has promise of the finest crop in the history of the state. Barley harvest will begin, and on all the early grain through Minnesota and South Dakota, by Aug. 1 harvest will be general.

Albert Lea, Minn., July 25.—The crops in this county are suffering for dry weather, as rains are so frequent and so heavy that haying cannot be done, and the ripened barley cannot be harvested.

Watertown, S. D., July 25.—Nothing but a general hall storm or long prevailing hot winds can prevent South Dakota from harvesting one of the most bountiful crops in its history.

Madella, Minn., July 25.—A destructive hail storm occurred about 4 o'clock Thursday afternoon four miles east and south-east of Madella.

Marshall, Minn., July 25.—One of the most destructive hail storms known in this vicinity occurred at noon yesterday.

Grand Forks, N. D., July 25.—The severest electrical storm of the season passed over the country southwest yesterday. Vivid and continuous lightning kept the sky in a blaze.

Battle Lake, Minn., July 25.—An electric storm passed over this village yesterday. The lightning struck Andrew Stinson's house and barn, killing a cow.

Jasper, Minn., July 25.—A heavy rain fell at Jasper yesterday afternoon. South and east hail did much damage to standing grain.

FOR IMPERIAL FEDERATION THE SWIFT-ARMOUR COMBINE

Feeling in London Regarding the Issue—Some of Australia's Troubles.

London, July 25.—The feeling in London regarding colonial federation is that Canada is not yet ripe for closer connection with the mother country, and no closer connections will be made until the population of the dominion is richer, more and more, in the able and energetic to a common purse for imperial federation.

We thus have the anomaly of British taxpayers providing the cost of a navy which protects Australian trade with the United States, trade which has been wrested from British merchants.
