For a fall outing costume this suit of blue stitched chevrot is ideal. The blouse jacket is somewhat shorter than the ordinary form, and has a double row of silk embroidery down the front in vee effect. The collar and cuffs are of velvet, the latter caught by gilt buttons. The waist is elaborately tucked in front, as is the skirt around the bottom.



This suit is of such a substantial but dressy nature that it could be worn either for traveling or afternoon wear. Made of black ladies' cloth, the waist blousees slightly in front and has a postilion back. The costume is elaborately trimmed with black and white braid, while down the front of the jacket is a double row of gilt buttons with two silk tassels on either side; braid and velvet adorn the collar and cuffs. The semi-trained skirt has three plaits on either side and is stitched at the bottom.
