Dairymen Amazed at Remarks of Prof. Alvord Who Denounced Butter Coloring.

Government Expert Very Freely Denounced by Members of the National Association.

Milwaukee, Oct. 25.—The National Creamery Buttermakers' association convention came to a formal adjournment yesterday afternoon after a short discussion of minor matters.

Earlier in the day, Professor H. E. Alvord, the great butter expert, and chief of the dairy bureau in the agricultural department at Washington made a "plain talk" which caused a stir.

"The coloring of butter is a dairy fraud," he said. "There are frauds and thefts which occur only in degree and not in principle, and I regret to say that in some instances our courts punish the smaller thefts and frauds more severely than they do the larger ones."

"The coloring of butter is a fraud, as well as the coloring of oleo, and I regard increasing the coloring of butter as impolitic. The general and popular movement is toward suppressing food frauds, especially adulterations, preservatives and artificial coloring, and I hope to live long enough to see all fraud and deception in dairy products abolished, including the artificial coloring of pure butter."

The dairymen were dumfounded for a moment, and then there arose a murmur which terminated in something approaching a riot.
