MINNESOTA

HILL DEFENDS HIS POLICY

Great Northern, He Says, Has Reduced Rates and Increased Wages. CROOKSTON, MINN.—In his address to the farmers yesterday, President Hill said the supreme purpose of his road was the prosperity of the northwest. He declared he had paid a beginning of reductions in rates and he advised the farmers to quit grumbling, being emphatic in his assertion that Red River valley land is worth more than \$25 an acre.

So far from it being the object of the Great Northern to rob the people, Mr. Hill said that the road had reduced rates during the year, and at the same time had paid an increase in wages amounting to \$700,000, there being no increase in the number of men employed.

He suggested that one reason for the better development of the Dakota side of the Red River valley than the Minnesota side was the fact that the former had been less suspicious of the railroads and had given more hearty cooperation in their efforts to develop the country.

NORTHFIELD, MINN.—A reception was held at Grady's parlors last evening yesterday afternoon by Miss Margaret J. Evans, dean of the woman's department, for her guest, Miss Hodgkins, who was formerly a teacher in Wellston, Minn. Miss Hodgkins gave a very interesting address on foreign missions, which was much appreciated by the guests.

WINONA, MINN.—Governor Van Sant, accompanied by Samuel G. Iverson and Julius H. Block, is campaigning to-day in his home county. The party arrived at St. Charles, Minn., and held a meeting at that place, at which there was a very large attendance. This afternoon they continued to Winona stopping at the Lewis and Clark hotel. The committee here held a meeting at which the names of Mr. Ford's supporters were illegitimately secured.

Another important waterworks decision has been handed down by the supreme court. This is in the Cedar Rapids water-works case, the supreme court reversing the decision of the lower court strengthening the cause of municipalities in the state in dealing with franchise-holding corporations.

DETROIT, MINN.—Ole Walstrom, a well-known farmer, was killed to-day by his horse. Walstrom had started home and had evidently stood up in his white shirt on the road. The thin boards which the horse stepped on were constructed to give way and his feet went through and were caught between the reach and braces. He fell forward and his horse became frightened and began kicking. When found his dead body was hanging over the dashboard.

ROCHESTER, MINN.—The republican rally in Rochester to-night is the best of the campaign. Governor Van Sant spoke in the Grand opera-house, which was crowded. The Queen City band gave a selection of music and the republican club. Governor Van Sant gave one of the most stirring addresses on the political issues of the day ever heard in this city and made many votes.

BRECKENRIDGE, MINN.—One of the most disastrous prairie fires in the history of this section swept across Wilkin county, burning over 140,000 acres, and being finally stopped by one of the state ditches. About 5,000 acres were burned over, and several hundred tons of hay were destroyed.

ST. CLOUD, MINN.—A decision handed down by the secretary of the Interior gives James H. Eganette title to 150 acres of land in Miller Lake county, with \$2,000 improvements. The terminal Dispatch association has been instructed to allow St. Cloud forty-eight hours for loading and unloading cars. The new rule will take effect at once.

BETHEL, MINN.—The head and shoulders of a man were found hanging in a tree in the woods. The remainder of the body was found lying on the ground. The parts were unrecognizable, but it is thought to be the body of a man named Johnson who left for two miles northeast of Bethel last April.

EVANSVILLE, MINN.—A bad collision was narrowly averted to-night. An engine and caboose were standing on a siding, and a heavy freight train came in and ran upon the same siding. It was through the skill of the two engineers that the collision was averted.
