

SHOWED HEAVY LOSS

Fletcher's Vote Fell Far Behind the Republican Congressional Vote at Primaries.

The Full Republican Vote Was Well Ahead of the Primary Registration.

Congressman Fletcher received 17,701 votes for congress last Tuesday. At the primary election, Sept. 15, Mr. Fletcher received 11,259 votes.

In every other ward Mr. Fletcher lost a large per cent of the republican votes. The loss was largest in South Minneapolis, but in the thirteenth ward it amounted to a third, and was nearly one-fifth in the strong republican eighth ward.

The primary vote on all republican congressional candidates, compared with the Fletcher vote by wards, is as follows:

The Primary Vote Exceeded.

Although there was a large stay at home vote, the total cast was larger than at the primaries, owing to the registration on the second and third days. The primary election vote in the city was 20,849 for the republicans, 8,872 for the democrats, a total of 29,721.

The normal republican vote was about that cast for Governor Van Sant and for Hugh Scott for county auditor. Van Sant ran somewhat behind in the seventh, eleventh and twelfth wards, but his total vote was very close to the republican vote at the primaries.

Scott's vote exceeded Van Sant's by 112. The vote by wards, compared with the primary vote, is as follows on these two candidates:

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
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
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
