


### Diet for State's Wards

### PLEASED WITH SALE

Breeders of Shorthorns Express Their Satisfaction at Results of Yesterday's Sale.

More Than Sixty Animals Chosen Hands at an Average of \$167.50—List of Sales.

Success crowned the sale of blooded Shorthorn stock held by the Minnesota Live Stock Breeders' association at the state fair grounds yesterday. Some sixty animals were sold at prices ranging from \$450 to less than \$100, the average being for the herd being \$167.50. At the close of the sale Dean Liggett and Professor Shaw of the state school of agriculture both expressed themselves as highly gratified at the results.

"For a first sale this has been very satisfactory," said the dean. "Of course most of the offerings went cheap, but a few of the animals were not very desirable, and the better stock brought good prices. This is the first sale ever held here outside of fair week, and I am greatly pleased."

Professor Shaw expressed himself in similar terms; and stockmen in attendance seemed to believe that a long step had been taken toward creating a local stock market that is expected ultimately to develop, so that it will become unnecessary for Minnesota breeders to send

their animals to Chicago or Kansas City in order to secure fair prices. The greater part of the stock sold yesterday was entered by C. N. Brown, Austin; C. E. Clark, St. Cloud; T. H. Canfield, Lake Park; S. Fletcher, Matteson, St. D.; J. J. Furlong, Austin; F. W. Martin & Son, Wood Lake; F. McMartin, Claremont; J. C. Mills, Preston; L. Stannard, Taylors Falls, and D. A. C. Wedge, Albert Lea. The purchasers were Minnesota breeders almost exclusively, and the animals will, therefore, remain on Minnesota farms and will raise the standard of Minnesota herds.

Most of the breeders who contributed stock to the sale also appeared in the ring as purchasers. "I suppose you might say I've been trading on the stock exchange," said one of them jocularly; "but it ain't gambling when you buy a bull like that," and he turned to gaze after a splendid animal then being led from the ring and which he had just added to his herd.

Among the largest purchasers were Thomas Harburn, St. Cloud; James O'Hara, Lanesboro; Thomas H. Canfield, Lake Park; S. B. Scott, Zumbrota; Dr. A. C. Wedge, Albert Lea, and William Bethesda, Ontonagon. The highest price realized at the sale was \$450, paid by T. H. Canfield for C. E. Clark's Violet, a red cow, 6 years old, bred by G. A. Brodie, Tanny Taylor (1 year), W. A. Morrill, Albert Lea, \$450.
