AN INFLUX OF GOODS

Westbound Steamers on the Atlantic Are Crowded With Foreign Freight.

New York, Nov. 25.—A more favorable situation has been gradually developed recently in shipping circles, according to the Journal of Commerce. There has been little improvement in the demand for outfitting cargo accommodation, but as to the westbound voyages the movement has assumed enormous proportions—at any rate so far as the continental lines are concerned. The British lines, also, have shown improvement, but their steamers are still coming this way with half cargoes and in some instances third cargoes.

With the continental lines, however, it is not an overstatement that during the last month or six weeks the condition has been one of unprecedented activity. For the first time since they have been built, the big cargo boats of the Hamburg-American lines have come over crowded to their full limit. Other lines report similar conditions.

THE DELAWARE CASE

The President Explains Why He Appointed an Addicks Man.

Washington, Nov. 25.—On his return to Washington, the president pointed out that some misapprehension existed as to the appointment of the United States attorney for Delaware, who was an Addicks man, and authorized the following statement regarding it:

Mr. Byrne was originally appointed United States attorney of Delaware by President McKinley. President Roosevelt knew him personally. In the opinion of the president he had rendered excellent service for the public good in more than one direction, and he had been a staunch supporter of the president when he ran for governor and afterwards.

He was reported by the department of justice as a fit and competent district attorney, and the president had entire confidence in his ability and integrity. He accepted the nomination for congress. Other district attorneys and marshals had such nominations without being requested to resign, but in view of the factional fight in Delaware the president thought that Mr. Byrne would better resign, which he accordingly did.

When the election was over the president reappointed him without having given him the slightest previous indication that such was his intention. He would have been reappointed without regard to the circumstances under which he ran or the faction with which he was allied.

NO REDDRESS FOR POTTER.
Albany, N. Y., Nov. 25.—Governor Odell has received an opinion from Attorney General Davies in the case of Nathan Potter, former member of the St. Paul National League team. Wilnot says that he will remain in Minneapolis, whatever offers he may receive from outside. He has established his home here and does not care to move.
