Gigantic Scheme to Build Double Track Railroads and Defy All Western Systems.

Improvements About Kansas City, but a Bagatelle of the Expenditures Contemplated.

Special to The Journal. Omaha, Neb., Dec. 12.—The improvements and large investments which Armour, Swift and allied interests have made about Kansas City are a mere trifle when compared to the gigantic plan of which they form but a small part.

This scheme embraces nothing less than the ultimate connection of Chicago, Sioux City, Omaha, St. Joseph and Kansas City by a double track railway, with perhaps an extension into Texas and the cattle country of the southwest.
