THE COAL REPORT

The Commission's Finding to Be Made Soon.

Washington, March 2.—The report of the coal strike commission will be given to the president in a few days. The early decision is due to unlooked-for unanimity among the commissioners on the main points involved. They have given over the testimony of the 566 witnesses which they have received in 900 written pages, and have discussed the chief points. It is expected that the report will be unanimous as far as the main features are concerned. The commissioners hope there will be no minority report, but if there is one it will relate only to minor features.

The house committee on banking and currency has reported a bill to amend an act approved August 1, 1892, authorizing a favorable report on the Fowler currency bill.

The resignation of Assistant Appraiser J. B. Tillman of New York, in charge of woolen goods, for the good of the service, was accepted.

The president has sent to the senate the following nominations of postmasters: Minnesota—Thomas H. McLaughlin, Hennepin; Taylor, Chaska; T. F. Cronlund, Tyler; Minnesota—Herbert O. Cheven, Grant Falls.

The senate has passed the amended bill for the opening of the Rosebud Indian reservation in South Dakota and it was reported favorably by the other house. It will take the place of the house bill on the calendar. Representative Burton, who is the author of the bill, said today that if the democrats continued their filibuster to the end of the session, there was little hope of its passage.

Representative Tawney, the republican whip, took notice of a resolution to present a bill on the presence of a quorum in the house which has consumed an hour each day since Thursday. He sent word to the republican members saying "your presence is earnestly desired in the house."
