Dr. Georg Sauerwein is a German philologist, who, in addition to his native tongue, speaks in thirty-eight different languages. He has distinguished himself by his keen interest in the promotion of the Scandinavian cause. He was the orientalist congress at Stockholm in 1889 an album of greetings in thirty languages and prepared a poem in thirty-eight languages, but declined to forward it owing to the controversy it would have caused.
