### ENLARGING THE SCHOOLS

The Board of Education Enjoys the Novelty of Opening Building Bids.

The board of education this afternoon passed on the bids for the construction of the new Hawthorn school. The bids for general construction are: R. 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## CHECKING GOES ON NEW SHARING PLAN

Controller Rogers' Objection to Unique System of Service Gratuities Introduced by the First National Bank.

Is Without Effect.

He Intimates That Any Mistakes Discovered Will Be Chargeable to Other Officials.

It Is the Idea to Encourage Loyalty, Long Service and Thrift.

The First National bank has maintained its record as pioneer among Minneapolis banks in innovations for improvement in its service and in the maintenance of cordial relations with its employees by the establishment of a gratuity fund. It thus takes a long step in the realm of "civil Mr. Rogers fairly bristled as he referred to recent articles bearing upon his attitude toward the men appointed by the committee to check up the account.

"I want it understood right here and now," he said, "that these newspaper reporters must be stopped, and especially that pipe dreamer of The Journal."

Referring to The Journal's account of a recent scene in his office, of which Alderman McCoy, Custodian Gaylord and a reporter were witnesses, he said: "I want it understood that no eavesdropper of The Journal will be allowed behind my counter again."

He declared he had been misrepresented all through his controversy with the accountants, and he warned the latter on no account to publish anything in the press without first consulting the committee, any statements which reflected upon the conduct of his office. In regard to any evidence of the accountants which might be discovered in the controller's office, he disclaimed any responsibility whatever, saying that the blame must be placed entirely upon the city engineer's and county auditor's offices.

Must Admit Accountants.

On the advice of the city attorney, with whom the republican members of the committee sided, the controller was forced to recede from his position of attempting to deny the accountants access to any of his books. Both Mr. Stacy and T. S. Dickey are to be given free access to all of the accounts of the controller's office during the hours of business, and the accountant may be present when it is produced. Books are not to be removed from the controller's office, and the use of ink is forbidden.

The controller had declared that it was unnecessary for Mr. Stacy to inspect the revolving fund account. Mr. Stacy insisted on all other accounts, and that his work will be seriously hampered if he is not privileged to refer to it.

"It is impossible," said Mr. Stacy, "to make a full investigation of the condition of any fund whatever without considering the revolving fund, as the investigation thus far conducted has shown that the fund and the permanent improvement, sinking, interest, and several ward funds. No full and satisfactory report on the city's financial condition can be made without a thorough investigation of the revolving fund. There is little question that from \$1,000 to \$25,000 a year for a long series of years has been improperly charged to the revolving fund.
