HERO OF INDIAN WAR

Wm. Bourret, the Contractor, Whose Funeral Was Held Here This Morning.

Was Captured by Redskins—In Attempting to Escape, Was Shot Five Times.

William Bourret, the Minneapolis contractor whose death was announced yesterday, was a pioneer Minnesotan and a well-known figure among the veterans of the great Sioux outbreak.

Born at Les Roches, Quebec, Mr. Bourret came to Minnesota as a youth in 1858. He was employed at Mendota as a clerk in the trading post conducted by H. H. Sibley, the future governor.

Mr. Bourret, although 45 years old, was presumed to be in perfect health when he went recently to Three Lakes, Wis., to take charge of a railroad contract at that point.

move and repeat the operation with a fresh surface of paper. A grease spot will appear on the paper when the iron is lifted. Be sure that in applying again this spot does not get against the fabric and re-transfer itself. Keep using fresh paper until the hot iron brings away no more grease; then brush thoroughly with rags from wax candles that can be removed in this way.

A dealer in charge of an exhibit of English china at the Chicago exposition gave me a piece of information about the care of gold decoration on china. "Wash it in water just hot as you like," he said, "but don't put soap on it. Soap dyes the gold and makes it rub off."—Good Housekeeping.

A superior way—both as to method and results—to clean a knitted or crocheted wool baby afghan is to put it into an old pillow case before sopping it up and down in a generous quantity of naphtha or gasoline. Do not rub or wring. When ready to take from the cleaning agent, press gently against the side of the tub to remove the case and dry out of doors or in a current of fresh air. A large couch cover can be treated successfully in the same manner, using a tub of flour and butter, brown them together in a saucepan, add one cupful of the liquor in which the meat was cooked and stir until thick and smooth. Season highly with cayenne or paprika, simmer for five minutes, then add four tablespoonfuls of cream and the diced meat. Stir well, drop in two hard-boiled eggs, cut lengthwise into quarters, and simmer gently for ten minutes longer.
