

MAY WHEAT HARMED DOWN AGAIN TO 73C. A GOOD 5C LOWER

The Week Opened With the Bearish Reports Still Coming Concerning Winter Wheat.

Corn Had a Sharp Break and This Gave Opportunity for the Wheat Bears.

The Wheat Visible Decreased Moderately—Gossip of the Trade.

Minneapolis Chamber of Commerce, March 16.—Under the influence of continued bearish news, wheat opened the week depressed and inclined to weakness. On every turn of selling the market sagged, and it was impossible to stir up enough of a buying order to make the price May opened at 73c and sold off to 72 3/4c, where it held awhile. The early foreign news was unimportant, although unchanged. The weakness came entirely from the domestic news, which was bearish in almost every item.

Whitcomb, Case & Co., from New York: The Armour selling of corn is inducing good deal of interest in the grain market. The indications are that he sold quite a little Saturday. If he has given up the long side of May, corn, I believe July is now to sell over 70c. There is no demand for corn, either for interior or export. There is a small amount of corn on hand, but it is a sale. We have had a rather heavy break in wheat, but at the same time it does not seem to bring any export business, and Minneapolis receipts seem to be over those of last year. It does not look as if they were going to be short of wheat for a while. There is no doubt but that we are going to have larger receipts of oats. The market for oats is quiet, which will be in about two weeks, farmers will commence to sell, as the scarcity of oats has to do with the weakness in the wheat market, getting in shape to do business.
