A BOUNDARY LAW

Trans-Missouri Counties Believe They Have One at Last That Will Stick.

Act Sustained by a Supreme Court Was the Model of the North Dakota Bill.

Special to The Journal. Bismarck, N. D., March 17.—After ten years of experimenting, the representatives of the counties west of the Missouri river believe they have a county boundary bill that will stick. The bill was approved by the governor this week, and attaches Bowman county to Billings, Hettinger, Dunn and part of Williams to Stark, and a part of the B. & N. county to Mercer. The voters of the three counties must approve the proposed change before it can be effective, so that the law cannot take effect until the next general election.
