R. R. TRAFFIC IN THE N. W.

The Burlington Still Has Much More Than It Can Do—Merger Roads Busy.

Special to The Journal. New York, April 9.—Traffic returns from the middle west along the North-Western is leading all the other roads in the matter of grain tonnage.

The grain movement last week was by that road last week having been 683,000 bushels, compared with 529,000 bushels for St. Paul, 359,000 bushels for Rock Island, and 327,000 bushels for Burlington.

The nationalities of the immigrants were: English, 2,447; Scotch, 1,483; 307; Welsh, 51; Canadians returned from the United States, 373; Americans, 1,341; English Canadians, 3,858; German, 1,011; Hungarians, 228; Italians, 312; Dutchmen, 415; Swedes, 263; Norwegians, 421; French, 119. Other nationalities making up the remainder.
