IS IT A REAL HODAG?

A Most Uncanny Nocturnal Brute at Minnetonka Reported by A. H. Opsahl.

AN EMINENT THEOSOPHISTS

C. W. Leadbeater, Who Lectures Here, an Original Investigator.

The local branch of the Theosophical society and all investigators of the occult and scientific lines are greatly interested in the proposed arrival of C. W. Leadbeater of London, one of the great teachers of theosophical doctrines. Mr. Leadbeater will arrive in Minneapolis this week to begin his series of lectures on the training of students of theosophy. In the twin cities he will give three public addresses, Wednesday evening on "Man and His Body," and Thursday evening on "Reincarnation," both of which will be free. A lecture prepared at the special request of the Chicago theosophists on "Men Visible and Invisible," will be given by stereoscopic views will be given May 6, but for this an admission fee will be charged. Besides these lectures Mr. Leadbeater will give several afternoon talks for which tickets are being distributed to those known to be interested and other work he will do only with members of the society.

Mr. Leadbeater is in America to further the development in theosophists of the power of greater service to the world. He has been for many years a close student of theosophy and psychic phenomena and he is placing those desiring the knowledge and power that he has acquired in the way of acquiring them for themselves, by the study of theosophy in Americans the most natural psychics in the world and looks for great results when their interest and attention have been directed to psychic phenomena.

Mr. Leadbeater was formerly a clergyman of the high church party of the Church of England. Becoming interested in theosophy, he went to India as an inquirer. He has investigated all of the forms of psychic phenomena and has tested them for himself. He has given much attention to clairvoyance which he treats not as a merely a hobby, but as an extension of the ordinary vision and hearing. According to his belief theosophy teaches nothing new, but has winnowed out of the mass of the false systems of religious and philosophical thought and experience that have become choked up with error and materialism. His studies of the future have just been issued in a book entitled "The Other Side of Death."

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NEW GUARD EQUIPMENT

It Will Be Issued After Inspection by Two Regular Army Officers.

Lieutenant Colonel Alfred Reynolds, second infantry, United States army, and Captain Charles F. Dwyer, Twenty-first infantry, United States army, will conduct an inspection of the Minnesota National Guard for the purpose of issuing the new equipment of the United States government. All information concerning the number and efficiency of this state's militia will be secured in conformance to the provisions of the new law providing for the arming of militia with Krag-Jorgensen rifles. The inspection will be conducted in Minneapolis according to the following schedule:
