A DELIGHTFUL WEEK

D. A. R. Convention in New York Was Marked by Many Social Functions.

Boston Secures Next Meeting After an Exciting Contest With New York.

New York, May 20.—The Daughters of the Revolution completed the business of their annual convention this morning by a meeting of the new governing board.

The week has been one marked by many delightful features, from the impressive opening religious service on Sunday at Old St. Paul's chapel on lower Broadway, to the long day of country wandering yesterday in the historic haunts about Peekskill.

The week was arranged for enjoyment and not a cloud marred the pleasure either in the blue sky of New York or in the society horizon as the members gathered in the myrtle room of the Waldorf-Astoria to report formally the work of the year.

The principal strength of the Daughters of the revolution lies in a group of half a dozen of the original thirteen colonies and the delegates were largely eastern women. Colorado, alone, of the western states, had a large delegation.

The status of the Valley Forge memorial was a matter of much interest to the members. There was much rejoicing when it was reported that the committee, having at length fully satisfied all of the conditions imposed by the owners of the Valley Forge camp site, the land sur-

rounding the Daughters of the Revolution monument had been deeded to the society just before the opening of the convention. Delay had been caused by the necessity of remaking the roads, the macadam not having been found satisfactory.

The special functions of the convention were distinctly smart and, therefore, delighted the feminine hearts of all the delegates. It was a large and distinguished company that occupied most of the best seats Tuesday night at the Manhattan theater to see the "Earl of Pawtucket," a diverting society play that did not demand too close attention to the stage. On Wednesday the luncheon was held at Hotel Savoy, the banquet hall of which is considered by many competent judges the handsomest in New York.
