

ASK FRIARS TO STAY

Centro Catolico de Filipinos Sends Resolutions to the American Catholic Federation.

They Declare the Franciscans, Dominicans and Recollects to Be Worthy of Trust.

Cincinnati, May 26.—One of the most important documents bearing on the Philippine situation ever sent to this country has just been received here at the headquarters of the American Federation of Catholic societies.

The document is an official one and comes from the Centro Catolico de Filipinos, the most representative Catholic body in the Philippine islands, and voices the opinion of the bishops as well as the several million loyal Roman Catholics.

"On one side there was the schism provoked by Bishop Aglipay, which is supported by only fourteen parishes without reputation, but which is spreading, especially in the country districts. This movement is helped by the dominant political party trying to persuade the population to rebellion against Rome and saying that the expulsion of the friars is indispensable to independence.
