

SPORTS. MICHIGAN WILL WIN Wolverines Are Conceded the Best Chance to Capture Conference Track Meet.

Chicago and Wisconsin Also Look Strong—Illinois and Minnesota Come Next.

It looks very much as if Michigan by winning the western conference track meet at Chicago for the third time, would become the permanent possessor of the handsome cup offered by a Chicago firm.

In the quarter-mile Rebetock of Michigan and Foage of Wisconsin are picked to fight for the prize which is credited with a mark of 49.85, made in the dual meet between Wisconsin and Illinois last year.

In the half-mile race is between three men, Hall of Michigan, Cahill of Chicago and Breikretz of Wisconsin. Cahill and Breikretz are expected to do the best in the winter meet, which has been the best record, 2:00 3-5, but has been beaten by Hall in much slower time. This is anybody's race.

The distance runs promise some fast finishes. In the mile Michigan has Kellogg with a record of 4:30 2-5 indoors; Perry, 4:34 2-5, and Conger, 4:40 1-5, indoors. Hall of Chicago has done 4:38, and Keachle of Wisconsin holds the western record with 4:31 2-5.

Hahn of Wisconsin also has done good work and has a record this year of 4:41 indoors. Hall of Chicago holds the record for the two-mile 9:26, but it is no cinch that he will beat Kellogg of Michigan, who won the two mile at the conference meet last year.

McEachron of Wisconsin is another good man, and has the advantage of being trained by Kilpatrick, himself a famous runner in past years. Both the mile and two-mile will be decided largely by condition and handwork.

With Bockman eliminated from the hurdles, the most likely men are Stewart of Michigan, Catlin of Chicago and Barakids of Wisconsin. None of the men is in a class with Bockman or Malone, the old rivals of the last three years.

Catlin beat Stewart in the dual meet and may repeat the trick. The pole vault, between Magee of Chicago and Dvorak of Michigan, either of whom is likely to make a new record this year.
