Company's Receipts for 1903 About \$4,500,000 in Excess of the Year 1902.

The Increase in the Total Acreage Sold Was Correspondingly as Great.

Special to The Journal. Winnipeg, Man., July 1.—The Canadian Pacific railroad land department closed its fiscal year yesterday with receipts exceeding by about \$4,500,000 those of the year preceding.

The monthly returns for June are even more favorable. The total acreage sold has increased about one-third over that of June, 1902, but notwithstanding the average price paid an acre has gone up over half a dollar.
