RAILROADS. FEW RECEIVERS NOW

The Railroad Variety Especially is in Small Demand Since January, 1903.

Figures Compiled by Railway Age—Street Railway Companies Don't Fare So Well.

The Railway Age says to-day that the business of railway receivership has fallen off. The whole record of receivership from Jan. 1 to June 30 is comprised in the following table:

Together these three concerns represent only \$1,146,000 of bonds and stocks, while during the corresponding period of 1902 the foreclosures, sales numbered 11, covering 249 miles of road and \$12,707,000 of capitalization.

The Railway Age has compiled a list of five street railway companies placed in the hands of receivers since Jan. 1. These show a total length of 577 miles of track, representing \$27,583,000 of bonds and \$25,368,050 of stock.

In addition to these, a Pennsylvania traction company, operating 35 miles and having \$4,000,000 of securities outstanding, is also in receivership.

GOVERNMENT'S VIEW Purpose of Canadian Northern as Seen by Parliament.

Special to the Journal. In the debate on the bill to grant aid to the Canadian Northern railway, the minister of railways said the question of aid to the Canadian Northern was quite apart from the general problem of transcontinental railways.

Canadian Northern people had never expressed a desire to go to the Pacific in the near future.

Canadian Northern project, as sanctioned by the government, is aimed at the immediate service of settled districts. The minister of railways said that when the Canadian Northern was built, much of the western grain would be transported over it instead of over the other lines.

MILWAUKEE TO ST. LOUIS New Route Has Been Quietly Planned in Milwaukee.
