MINNESOTA FINE RAFTING YEAR But One Raft Lost This Season at Duluth End of the Lake.

Drives on the Water Courses the Cleanest and Best in a Long Time.

Special to The Journal. Duluth, Minn., Aug. 1.—Concerns towing logs on Lake Superior this year state that they have never had so good a season.

The season has been excellent, too, for driving on streams, and some logs have been successfully taken out that were generally supposed to be fixtures on the upper waters.

Big Piling Contract. The Hines Lumber company has taken a contract from the Barnett & Record company for the Canadian Northern road, for 8,000 40-foot piles, to be delivered at Port Arthur, Ont., within thirty days.

Logging Road Construction. The Hines company is building a logging road across Duluth and on the river to the Omaha road near Rockmont to a point on the Great Northern near Foxboro.


