



NEW STATE RIFLE PIT FOR THE CAMP AT LAKEVIEW

Range of Minnesota Guardsmen to Be Made One of the Best in the Country—Preparation for the State Rifle Camp and the Interstate Shoot to Be Held Next Month.

Special to The Journal. Lake City, Minn., Aug. 8.—Improvements are to be made in the national guard rifle range at this place which will make it one of the best in the country.

This will be protected from the firing point by a parapet stone wall, three feet wide at the base and sloping to two feet at the top.

The principal improvement will be in the pit which is to be moved back 100 yards, and will allow for a 600-yard range.

Real Estate MINNE AND LOS A.

Former Minneapolis Man Complains of Taxes in Southern California Metropolis.

Compares Assessed Valuations of the Two Cities—Unfair to Local Property.

H. L. Gordon, now of Los Angeles, but for many years famous in Minneapolis as "Thundering" Gordon, has taken up the cudgels in the city in opposition to a ballot of a smaller tax rate and more equitable assessments.

By the census of 1900 Minneapolis had a population of 202,715. By the 1901 census Los Angeles had 102,473, a difference in favor of Minneapolis of 100,242. Conservative estimates (of city officials) place the population of Minneapolis to-day at 235,000. Conceding to Los Angeles the highest estimate (by competent men) of her present population, to-wit, 125,000, Minneapolis leads Los Angeles by 110,000 population, or nearly 89 per cent.
