Good Races Seen at the State Fair Despite the Unfavorable Weather.


Norman B. Wins the 2:17 Trot, and Castlewood Easily Takes 2:18 Pace.

In the first heat of the trot Fanfaron drew the pole, with Norman B. second and Dalton McCarthy third. Norman B. got a little the worst of the start and dropped back to third place on the turn. Fanfaron maintained a slight lead all the way round, but the four horses came down the stretch almost abreast. Norman B. came up strong and was a close

second to Fanfaron, while Dalton McCarthy took third. The time was good, 2:14. Norman B.'s good finish won him many supporters in the second heat. Maggie V. broke just after the start, but her driver quickly steadied her and went hard after the field. Fanfaron and Norman B. had a hot brush on the back stretch, but Fanfaron was still ahead when they turned into the stretch, and maintained this lead until within a hundred yards of the finish. Here Norman B., urged by voice and lash, made a magnificent spurt, and just as he passed Charlotte E., who was the most exciting finish of the week, Maggie V. passed Dalton McCarthy and got third. The time was still good, 2:14.

In the third heat it was a struggle between Norman B. and Fanfaron again, the Maggie V. for the time threatened to make trouble for the leaders. Norman B. was again victorious, with Maggie V. third. Maggie V. got off well in the fourth heat and pushed Norman B. all the way, but never seriously threatened him. Fanfaron got third. The time in the last two heats was slow, the track after the last being in wretched condition. The bunched in the pace.
