The Great Banda Rossa Will Give Concerts Until Sunday Evening.

The Wagner Program a Big Success—Verdi Music Tonight.

It has been definitely announced that the great Banda Rossa has been secured for three more days, six concerts, and will not close its engagement at the Exposition until Sunday evening. This will prove good news to those who have been prevented by the wretched weather of the last few days from hearing the band. It has been hoped that such a result might be achieved, and the success of the management will meet with a warm response. The musical clubs of the city are becoming warmed up to the idea that the success of the Banda Rossa concerts means much toward the success of the plan for securing a good music hall for Minneapolis, and along this line Frederic Fayram, president of the Philharmonics, has written Chairman Elwell, of the East Side park committee:

"Whether or not we are to have a good auditorium with suitable approach and surroundings is a matter of almost vital importance to our city. Every club, society and individual interested, directly or indirectly, in this question, should join in helping your committee in its endeavor to solve it satisfactorily. Inasmuch as it is understood that the Banda Rossa concerts are being given in aid of the fund for purchase and improvement of land adjoining International hall, the only auditorium at present available for general use, it seems to me that attendance at the concerts becomes a duty that every citizen owes to public welfare."

The Wagner program given by the Banda Rossa last evening at the International Exposition auditorium was a treat and was enjoyed by the largest audience of the season. The hall was delightfully warm and pleasant, and the band and its leader seemed to catch the enthusiasm of the occasion and played as never before. Once indeed, the inclemency of the weather was forgotten, and judging by the applause which greeted the various numbers, and the insistent demand for encores, the evening was hugely enjoyed.

The first part of the program was devoted to the lesser known, but proved to be a splendid selection. The delightful Sorrentino march "Liberty" aroused considerable enthusiasm which was further enhanced by the playing of Merchandante's "Regente" overture.

The Chopin fantasia afforded Sig. Basso an opportunity to display his virtuosity and he surpassed all expectations.

With the exception of Maud Ulmer Jones' selection the second part of the program was devoted to Wagner, and it was played right royally. Opening with the "Tannhauser" march, played as only the Banda Rossa can play it, the band followed with "March of the Knights of the Holy Grail" from "Parsifal," a splendid piece further enhanced by the playing of pet solo by Sig. Basso. "Walthers' Trauermusik" from "Die Meistersinger," "The Ride of the Valkyries" with its thrillingly thrilling program, and each number waked an ovation. Maud Ulmer Jones was never in better voice and sang Mascheroni's "For All Eternity" superbly. She was forced to respond to an encore.

To-night's program will be devoted to Verdi, the Master Italian, and will include a solo by Mrs. Jones, who will render Gertrude Sans Souci's popular ballad, "When Song Is Sweet." The program follows: "Liberty March".....Sorrentino Overture.....Sorrentino
