

ALL IS READY FOR WAR MANEUVERS

Regular Army Forces and State Militia Are Hurrying to Camp Young, Kentucky.

The War Game Proper, However, Will Not Open Up Until October 2.

Camp Young, West Point, Ky., Sept. 25.—With the commanding general on the ground and all preliminaries observed the regular troops from the department of the lakes began arriving to-day while others were "leaving stations" in different parts of the country for the war maneuvers.

Major General Bates is commanding the department of the lakes, is here with his staff. General Bates has issued a lengthy order for the guidance of the umpires, officers and troops during the maneuvers.

The automobile as a factor in warfare already has been given a trial by the regular corps men. Their lumbering "Red Eye" trucks in colors, have been last night, to one of the Kentucky "Knobs" surrounding the camp and was shoved back to a steamboat to be sent to Louisville for repairs.

LONDON MAILS DELAYED

Government and Railroads Dispute Over Cost of Transmission.

London, Sept. 25.—General indignation has been aroused here by a dispute between the postoffice authorities and the management of the London & North-Western railway over the payment for the transportation of mails by the American mails have been seriously delayed at Liverpool when, under exceptional circumstances, they have not been landed at Queenstown. It appears that the railroad disputes its liability to carry to London a large portion of the Atlantic mail than can be stowed away in an ordinary boat train, without extra payment.

The recent arrival of the Umbria's mail brought matters to a head, the railroad officials refusing to forward the surplus mail bags until the postoffice agreed to pay the cost. Confronted with this ultimatum, the postoffice complied under protest.

Upon the arrival of the Etruria, Sept. 19, the railroad took up a similar stand but on this occasion the postal authorities stubbornly declined to comply with the conditions. Consequently hundreds of mail bags brought by the Etruria were left at Liverpool and were forwarded to London in small numbers, as the accommodation of the postal cars of the ordinary trains permitted, the last portion of the Etruria's mails not leaving Liverpool until Monday.

GERMAN HORSES INFERIOR

The Prussian Master of the Horse Says So.

Berlin, Sept. 25.—Count von Lendorff, the Prussian master of the horse, has reported to Emperor William that the climatic and food conditions make German horses inferior to the English and French horses and that therefore a full regeneration of the German stock cannot be too quickly brought about by importing stallions.

Much of the horse food used in Germany now is being brought from America. Count von Lendorff suggests popularizing horse racing by permitting bookmaking and Sunday racing.

FIREBUGS FORM ORGANIZATION

Its Object Is to Protect Incendiaries When They Get Into Trouble.

Members Have Been Successfully Engaged in Swindling Insurance Companies in Chicago.

Chicago, Sept. 25.—"The Firebugs' Protective association"—which is the unofficial title of an organization that is declared by Fire Inspector Fulkerson to have an actual existence in Chicago.

Included in its membership are said to be the shrewdest incendiaries that ever infested the city. Its victims, to the extent of thousands upon thousands of dollars paid late years on losses of buildings and merchandise by fire, are the fire insurance companies. The entire workings of the organization will soon be described to the grand jury by Fulkerson and his assistants.

The existence of such an alliance of incendiaries was disclosed in the course of an investigation of a fire that took place early this month in a little shoe store on Lake street. The circumstances were suspicious and the proprietor was arrested when he presented a schedule to the insurance companies claiming a loss of \$2,200 when his entire stock could have been replaced for a few hundred dollars.

DANCED AND SUNG

James Keffer, the Condemned Murderer, Spent His Last Night in Revelry.

The request was granted and for several hours Keffer danced and sang to his heart's content.
