

WATER IN A BOWL

Novel and Effective Method of Irrigation Used at St. Anthony, Idaho.

Lava Basin Beneath the Valley Holds the Water Securely for the Crops.

From a Staff Correspondent. St. Anthony, Idaho, Sept. 24.—This is an old proposition, a rainless community, living and raising crops on the surface of an invisible artificial lake which is never allowed to rise above the surface of the fields. The valley is about twenty-five miles long and five to seven miles in width. The lava rock which underlies the soil forms a perfectly water-tight bowl with an average depth of about sixty feet. Until ten years ago the valley was a desert, and the bowl was empty of water. Now a canal has been cut from the Snake river, a little distance above this town, and there is water within the reach of the roots of crops which spread out for miles above and below the town.

This invisible lake proposition is a new one, even to experienced irrigators. It is a pleasant discovery for those who stumbled upon it, for it means irrigation without any of the trouble or hard work. Ordinarily it is necessary to lead the water in a large deep canal, and then to take it in a smaller canal to the field to be watered, and here to run it into lateral ditches and to stand and open trenches and furrows, and thus distribute the water on the surface of the soil. This process must be repeated whenever the land becomes dry. But up here in this kind of the Snake River valley all that the farmers have to do is to open the gate of the ditch and let the water flow promiscuously out upon the valley. The surface of the water rises in the bowl, and when the farmers have the water in the ditch and the gates are shut in the ditch and the flow is stopped. The soil is wonderfully fertile, and the potatoes grown here rival those of Greeley, Col.

Dad took advantage of all his rights under the land laws and became the owner of 1,100 acres of the best land. Now that land is worth from \$400 an acre up.

It is rather unusual for a man to become a western pioneer at the age of 55, and the example of St. Anthony's founder may be inspiring to some old men of 35, who, working on salaries in eastern cities, think they are too old and too hampered to get out into the west. Dad it was apparently an inspiration. He had been farming and raising cattle in a small way for years in the east, but one morning he came to the conclusion that his clothes were saturated with mud, and his feet were covered with mud, and he thought himself disgustedly and turning to his faithful servant, announced: "I'm going to get out of this, and by gum, I'm going to a country where it never rains or it rains just the time it dawns on his friends and relatives that Moon meant what he said.

NEW KIND OF TRUST

Lincoln Ministers Would Abolish the Weak Churches and Centralize the Funds.

Too Many Organizations Already, They Say, for the Good of Religion.

Special to The Journal. Omaha, Neb., Sept. 25.—Mammoth as some of the trusts recently organized in New Jersey, one has been formed in existence in Nebraska which will attract a widespread attention. At Lincoln, a trust of the churches is formed and, in effect, will be announced at a meeting of the ministers of the city Monday evening. Like all other trusts, this one has among its objects the abolition of the "little fellow" and the centralization of funds for the maintenance of religious institutions. The ministers say there are too many churches for the good of religion—too many weak churches and too many preachers. Sald a prominent Lincoln clergyman: "Everything to-day is tending towards consolidation and federation. It is keeping with the progress of the day that the churches unite to become more beneficial to mankind. "Churches can gain force by gathering congregations in fewer places of worship. Financial gains by the abolition of the small church will lead to the retention of able ministers and attendant higher educational advantages religiously. Charity coming from a single source is more competent than the many sources of more institutions and peoples. "Fewer churches will be easier on the pocketbooks of the church-going people. Each house of worship will have its own territory to work in and none will be permitted to exceed those boundaries." The idea has been growing in Lincoln for some months. Ministers are confident it will succeed.

STEWART GOES TO JAIL Meteoric Career of a Smooth Swindler Had Its Culmination in North Dakota.

Stewart yesterday pleaded guilty in district court to a charge of obtaining money under false pretenses and was sentenced to six months in the county jail and to pay a fine of \$100. Stewart's career in the financial world was a protean one. He deposited two bogus drafts, one for \$10,000, in the bank of Commerce, aggregating \$1,250. On the strength of the deposit of these for collection he drew checks against his account at the bank for \$265 and fled. He was tracked as far as Portland, but all the traces were lost. He then turned up in Dickinson, N. D., where he closed a deal with a big firm for a large tract of grazing and farm land, the purchase price being paid in advance. He was winned and dined for over a week by prospective sellers before he closed deal. DIDN'T FOLLOW THE FLAG

When the Colors Went to Guam the Constitution Stayed at Home.

Washington, Sept. 25.—According to the attorney general the constitution did not follow the flag in the case of the establishment of the United States government in the island of Guam.

When the American naval colony was originally established in Guam with Admiral, then captain, Leary, as the supreme power, one of his assistants, Lieutenant W. E. Stafford, obtained one of the very few good dwelling houses on the island by purchase from the owner, and improved it to such an extent that it became the most desirable residence there.

Governor Leary finally concluded that the government as an executive mansion and finally condemned the premises and took possession. Lieutenant Stafford made a vigorous protest against this summary proceeding and appealed to Washington for redress, financially and otherwise.

In his opinion the attorney general holds that the constitution has not been extended to Guam by congressional enactment, and that the sole powers of government of the island has been necessarily and properly committed by the president to the naval governor, and that in appropriating the property of Lieutenant Stafford Governor Leary was entirely within his authority, the exercise of the right of eminent domain, and that the United States has a clear and valid title to the property in dispute.
