Sealed bids will be opened in presence of bidders on October 24th, 1903, and contract awarded to highest and best bidder. A copy of advertisement and a certified cleek of 20 per cent of the amount bid based on estimate of five million must accompany bid.

The checks of unsuccessful bidders will be returned as soon as bid is rejected. That of successful bidder will be retained until bond is approved, and contract made, and then to be applied to purchase of timber. If successful bidder refuses or fails to enter into contract within a reasonable time, the money sent with bid will be forfeited to the United States. The usual bond will be required.
