

"GRAFT" IN THE I. T.

The Department of Justice Investigators Unearth Plenty of It.

How Booze Gets to the Indians—Tribesmen Who Hold Too Much Land.

Muskogee, I. T., Oct. 7.—The inspectors sent here by the department of justice will report plenty of "grafting" in the Indian territory.

The department of justice investigation has nothing to do with anything but federal officials. It does not touch the work of the Dawes commission, or of the Indian inspector, or the Indian agent.

In general there has been plenty of evidence to support the charges of "grafting" and corruption.

One of the first things discovered by the inspectors was that a thriving liquor trade was being carried on, and that those who were selling it, many of them being druggists, were paying certain bribes for exemption from arrest or prosecution.

Secret Service Men Redouble Their Efforts to Save the President From Cranks.

Washington, Oct. 7.—The frequent appearance of cranks at the White House has spurred the officers of the administration to further efforts to secure legislation for the better protection of the president.

Yesterday when the president attended the memorial services for Sir Michael Herbert half a dozen secret service men were detailed at the fashionable St. John's church.

They were dressed in long black frock coats and carried silk hats, as did the rest of those who attended. The people inside the church and those gathered on the sidewalk were carefully inspected by the detectives before the president left the White House.

When they were satisfied that no dangerous character was in the crowd the officers telephoned the White House and the president drove to the church.
