ANARCHY IN HONDURAS Defeat of Government at Elections Leads to All Kinds of Turmoil—Invasion Feared. New York Sun Special Service. Tegucigalpa, Honduras, Nov. 20.—Honduras is at present on the verge of anarchy and the conditions are such that a revolution may break out at any time. The government party was completely overthrown at the recent elections and the opposition controls the executive branch of the government. Consequently any measure favored by the administration is voted down and the dissatisfaction is strongly on the increase. The reported intention of Guatemala and Nicaragua to unite against Honduras, while apparently unfounded, has had the effect of adding to the general apprehension. If Guatemala was to take the offensive she would be in a position to cause much trouble as she maintains a large force on the Honduras border.
