A VIEW OF COLOMBIA

What an American Who Has Lived There Says of the People.

Charges of Lawlessness Not Sustained—People Hospitable and Educated.

One would be led to believe from much that is published that the people of the United States were of the opinion that Colombia had no rights that the United States were bound to respect in reference to the isthmus.

If these gentlemen would take a little time and look up the history of Colombia they would find that it is a country where the laws are respected to as large an extent as in our own country; that property rights are fully respected; that whenever property of foreigners is taken in times of war it is generally taken under procedure recognized by all nations as proper, and due compensation is made for the same.

When Colombia has been at war or has been involved in a civil war, it has been one, and has been fought to the finish. The frequent newspaper reports of revolutions do not state the facts, and at the hands of a fertile pen of some correspondent a petty riot, similar to a street railway strike in this country, assumes the magnitude of a revolution.

I have been to Colombia several times. I have lived among them nearly two years and enjoyed their hospitality, and also a large part of my time was spent in the mountains and jungles, I have spent a considerable time in the cities of Barranquilla, Medellin and Cartagena, and in other places of less size. The treatment accorded to foreigners, and especially Americans, has, so far as my observations have gone, been most courteous, obliging and gentlemanly.

Now, as to the charge of lawlessness in Colombia, it needs simply be said that it is far more safe to send gold 100 miles in Colombia than in the United States. I have seen a treasure of gold going thru the bush for over 100 miles and guarded by two peons only. The history of the country shows but two robberies of treasure trains, and these robberies were one by an Englishman and one by an American. I have repeatedly sent a barefooted peon 90 or 100 miles with several thousand dollars, and never lost a cent, although many other persons knew he was the bearer of what seemed to the peons a vast amount of money.
