## ITALY IS MUCH SURPRISED

### DID NOT EXPECT GREAT BRITAIN TO DESTROY VILLAGE UNDER ITALIAN PROTECTORATE.

Rome, Dec. 9.—Italy does not intend to co-operate with Great Britain in the campaign against the Mad Mullah, according to the reply of the under secretary of foreign affairs in the chamber of deputies yesterday. An interpellation on this subject was occasioned by the news that the British cruiser Mohawk had landed a detachment of marines at Durbo and set the village on fire. Durbo, being under Italian protectorate, it is contended that a British warship would not undertake belligerent operations there.

## DOWIE RESTORED

### Receivers Discharged from Zion City—Creditors Now Satisfied.

Chicago, Dec. 9.—John Alexander Dowie is jubilant, being again in control of Zion City and all its industries. The financial showing he made satisfied \$22; balance to market, 10,638,462. All the creditors, who yesterday made a formal motion before Judge Kohlsaat to have the receivership appointed by the United States district court dissolved. No objection being offered, Judge Kohlsaat discharged the receivers.

## OWE \$107,000; HAVE \$7

### Frazier Mountain Copper Company Has Queer Financial Statement.

New York, Dec. 9.—Investors in the Frazier Mountain Copper company of New Mexico were astounded to hear yesterday that the company was sold, but according to latest reports, \$46,000 is still owing on the purchase price of the property, and the company therefore has no legal title.

## HIS AIRSHIP FALLS APART

### PROFESSOR LANGLEY WITNESSES THE FINAL FAILURE OF HIS MUCH-BELOVED AEROPLANE.

Washington, Dec. 9.—Professor Langley's aeroplane was completely wrecked in the second attempt to sail it yesterday. The weather conditions being considered perfect it was decided to give the airship another trial a short distance from Washington down the Potomac, the result being the complete wreck of the airship. Everything had been in readiness for the trial for some days, so that was the right kind of weather. The aeroplane glided smoothly along the launching tramway until the end of the tramway was reached, when on being left to itself the aeroplane broke in two and turned completely over, precipitating Professor Charles M. Manly, who was operating it, into the icy water beneath the tangled mass.

Professor Langley was present to witness the test, and appeared crestfallen when he saw the product of months of study and labor broken in an enormous expenditure of money disappear beneath the water close to where he was standing aboard a tug.

## WILL SPEND \$373,000

### Carnegie Institute Appropriates that Sum for Research.

Washington, Dec. 9.—The trustees of the Carnegie institution yesterday authorized an aggregate expenditure of \$373,000 in grants for scientific research and \$40,000 for publications during the coming year. Action on requests for 1,022 grants, involving an allowance of \$3,000,000 a year, was indefinitely postponed. The following trustees were elected: Dr. John S. Billings, New York; Elihu Root, secretary of war; Charles D. Walcott, director of the geological survey; John Cadwalader, New York; Cleve E. Dodge, New York, and Judge Wirt How, New Orleans.

## MERGER FILES EXCUSE

### BRIEF OF COUNSEL URGES THAT ATTORNEY GENERAL'S INACTIVITY SHOWED HE ACQUIRED

Washington, Dec. 9.—In his brief on behalf of the Northern Securities company, filed yesterday, George B. Young insists upon a holding in effect that of the Union Pacific in the Northern Pacific was not contrary to the antitrust law, and "the inaction of the attorney general showed that this was also the opinion of that high officer, charged with the enforcement of the antitrust act."

Mr. Young's brief is a document of over 100 pages, and in it he traces minutely the origin of the merger. The movement for this consolidation he attributes largely to the raid of May, 1901, by hostile interests on Northern Pacific stocks, which was considered most important to prevent, and says the Union Pacific interests still held \$37,000,000 of the Northern Pacific.

On the question of consolidation in the securities company, Mr. Young says: "Its ownership of the shares of the two railway companies no more consolidates or controls those shares, or the two companies, or their property, than the ownership of two pieces of real estate by the same person consolidates them or the title to them."

## OPPOSE THE STANDARD OIL

### ROCKEFELLER INTERESTS MEET WITH FORMIDABLE RESISTANCE FROM GERMAN BANKERS.

Berlin, Dec. 9.—The Standard Oil company's control of 80 per cent of the German trade in petroleum is a sore point with leading Germans. To crush this monopoly the Deutsche bank and the Disconto Gesellschaft have recently acquired extensive wells in refineries in Rumania and Galicia.

At the same time the Standard Oil company bought properties in Rumania in the face of German opposition, supposedly inspired from this capital. Also the Americans are strongly entrenched in Germany, the banks have refused to lend to the life and are prepared to spend millions to break their hold, which has lately been somewhat weakened by Dutch and Russian competition.

Meantime the Standard Oil company is seeking an alliance with the Disconto Gesellschaft, but without success. Rockefeller will find the Germans banks formidable enemies. Besides possessing unlimited capital, they have assured themselves of a tremendous trade in petroleum, the relations they occupy with the banking world throughout the country. Their intimate connection with the government also guarantees them advantages the Americans will find hard to overcome.

## ARRANGED HER FUNERAL

### St. Louis Girl Gives a Party in Anticipation of Death.

St. Louis, Dec. 8.—Miss Ann Mathilde Uthoff had a premonition that she would die and gave a party at her home in this city five weeks ago expressly for the purpose of bidding her friends good-bye. Eight of these friends carried her body to the grave in New Bethlehem cemetery to-day. She had been a great sufferer for a number of years.

## THOUGHT HIM A "SOAB"

### Man Is Shot and Killed, the Police Say by Pickets.

Chicago, Dec. 9.—Mistaken for a strike breaker as the police believe, John Ochowski, a trunk maker, has been shot and killed. The crime is attributed by the police to union pickets of the striking tanners of the American Hide & Leather company whose principal plant is located a block from the scene of the shooting. No witness of the shooting has as yet been found.

## DUCKED THE TEACHER

### Boys Resented the School Marm's Reprimand—Nearly Killed Her.

Evansville, Ind., Dec. 6.—Two farmers who were passing school No. 12 in Sullivan county yesterday were only just in time to rescue the teacher, Miss Agnes St. Clair, from drowning. She reprimanded the scholars over a small matter in the morning and during recess the boys, ranging in age from 8 to 20 years, decided to give her a ducking. After school hours they led her to a pond where they had broken the ice and threw her into the water up to her neck. She was nearly dead from fright and cold.


