TWIN'S SHIVER IN COLD WAVE

Yesterday the Coldest Day of Season—Mercury Here Touched 19 Below.

To-morrow, the Weather Man Says, It Will Be About Even Zero.

The weather at 7 o'clock this morning, according to the official thermometer, was a dozen degrees warmer than at the same hour Sunday morning.

The coldest station, 7 and 8 o'clock Sunday morning the lowest temperature of the season was recorded—18.8 degrees below zero.

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Weather conditions seriously interfered with the telegraphic service throughout the northwest during the early hours of the day.

The service into the Chamber of Commerce was practically suspended until long after the noon hour, and as a result the market was something wonderful to behold and dangerous to fool with.

The Associated Press wires had a bad time of it and much of the news which came by way of Chicago was sent over the long distance telephone wires.

RECORD IN CHICAGO

Coldest Day Windy City Has Had for Thirty-three Years.

Chicago, Dec. 14.—Yesterday was the coldest day Chicago has experienced in thirty years for this time of the year.

Three deaths, more than a score of accidents, forty-seven fires, with which the half frozen firemen were scarcely able to cope, owing to frozen hydrants, were among the direct results of the cold.

EMPEROR TO TRY EDISON'S DEVICE

THE "VITALIZER" WILL BE USED ON KAISER'S THROAT.

Wilhelm's Physicians Hope That the American Invention May Restore His Health—He Is Not the Only Royal Personage Who Has Turned to Edison for Relief.

New York, Dec. 14.—A cable dispatch from Berlin, received here today, says: "It is understood that the Magneto-Electric Vitalizer, invented by Thomas A. Edison, Jr., which has attracted so much attention in the United States, is to be employed in the treatment of Kaiser Wilhelm's throat."

The instrument is reputed to possess marvelous powers in the treatment of obscure and intractable diseases and is said early to have attracted the attention of the emperor's physicians.

The necessary appliances are now said to be in the hands of Professor Schmidt, who has charge of the emperor's case.

When Thomas A. Edison, Jr., was seen in his laboratory, at No. 14 Stone street, New York, he declined either to affirm or deny this report.

"If Emperor William of Germany is using the Vitalizer he is not the only European potentate who relies upon it," he said. "Among my patients in this country are several governors and many United States senators and high court judges."

"No, I am not going to Germany for I have too much to do in America. In response to my recent invitation thousands of afflicted persons write me here from all over the world, and while their fees are only 2-cent postage stamps, I prefer the gratitude of these suffering people rather than foreign fame and decorations."

Company was formed, and would throw back into the hands of the Oregon Short Line the huge block of Northern Pacific stock that was deposited to secure the \$22,000,000 odd Northern Securities stock that is now in the vaults of the Equitable Trust company, securing the 4 per cent participating bonds of the Oregon Short Line.

It would practically put the Northern Pacific in the very hands that control the Oregon Short Line. His immediate associates would be least likely to choose as a desirable resting-place for those stocks.

Northern Securities treasury at present contains about 99 per cent of the stock of the Northern Pacific and about 75 per cent of the stock of the Great Northern. To re-exchange 25 per cent of the stock of the Oregon Short Line would put the Northern Securities in the position of owning a control of the Northern Pacific and less than a control of the Great Northern.

It is of course, possible that the going on of the States will bring positive evidence to show that the operation of the Northern Securities company has restrained trade in the Northwest. There is no doubt that an attempt whatever was made by the attorneys for the prosecution to prove this fact.

Short Selling Dangerous. The effect of these considerations in the offices of Wall street where they are known and understood is growing.

On the part of the Northern Securities has been steadily accumulated by two brokers, one supposed to be acting for Morgan and Hill and the other for Hartman. There is no doubt that more than 6 per cent of the stock floated at the present time.

Attorney General's Brief. It Was Filed To-day in the United States Supreme Court.

Washington, Dec. 14. The brief of the government in the case of the Northern Securities company and others, vs. the United States, on appeal from the circuit court of the United States for the district of Minnesota, was filed in the United States supreme court to-day.

After stating that the bill in the case was originally brought by the government to restrain the violation of the anti-trust law by the securities company in the consolidation of the Northern Pacific and the Great Northern railroads and that the decision of the court below was favorable to the contention of the United States, the brief enters into the following specifications as to the reasons for the action:

Causes of Action. The lines of railway operated by the defendants, the Great Northern railway company and Northern Pacific railway company are parallel and competing.

The combination is in restraint of interstate commerce and a monopoly. The concluding paragraph of Judge Taft's opinion in the circuit court is quoted as summing up the argument bearing upon the facts of the case, as follows:

Results of Merger. First, it placed the control of the two roads in the hands of a single person, to-wit, the securities company, by virtue of its ownership of a large majority of the stock of both companies.

Second, it destroyed every opportunity for competition between two roads engaged in interstate traffic which were natural competitors for business by pooling the earnings of the two roads for the common benefit of the stockholders of both companies; and according to the familiar rule that every one is presumed to intend what is the necessary consequence of his own acts, when done wilfully and deliberately, we must conclude that those who conceived and executed the plan aforesaid, intended among other things, to accomplish these objects.

Questions of Law. Has a combination been accomplished by means of the securities company in violation of section 1 of an act congress, approved July 2, 1890, entitled "An act to protect trade and commerce by prohibiting the earnings of trusts, monopolies, and combinations, hereafter called the antitrust act?"

Had Absolute Power. The final result of these transactions was that one and the same set of men—Mr. Hill and Mr. Morgan and their associates—being the ruling spirits among them—acting together under a charter agreement and thru the agency of a corporate organization became vested with absolute power of control of two parallel and competing systems of interstate railway.
