### MORE TIMBER FOR ITS MARKET

#### DULUTH SEES IT IN PROPOSED RAILROAD EXTENSION.

McKenzie and Mann Will Build, It Is Said, to a Direct Connection with the Zenith City—All-Rail Shipments of Lumber Have Started and Are Fairly Active—Business in Pulwood, Ties and Posts.

Duluth, Minn., Jan. 5.—H. Finger, of the Port Arthur Lumber company, is in the city on business, and says there is no doubt that McKenzie and Mann are to build their Port Arthur, Duluth & Western road to a connection with this city, either to the eastern terminus of the Duluth & Iron Range at Ely or in some other way. This will open a large amount of timber land to this market. Swallow & Hopkins will have something to do in this connection, for they have pre-empted the direct and only available right of way for a road to the east of Ely, and have built a logging railroad on it. This has given them absolute control of all timber growing on several lakes and along certain watercourses in that region, and they will not give up their position without compensation.

All-rail shipment of lumber is fairly active. Some of the mills are doing a large business that way. The American Lumber company is the pioneer in this line here and is reaping a rich reward, and the Red Cliff Lumber company is also active. Probably fully as much lumber will be shipped out all-rail as during any previous winter.

The McAlpine Lumber company is shipping out logs to the St. Louis mill in this city. It is also shipping ties to the Great Northern mill at Duluth. The Duluth Logging company, which will cut over 30,000 cords of pulpwood this winter, mostly on the line of the Duluth & Iron Range road, is also getting out large quantities of ties and posts near Grand.

G. C. Armstrong, head woodsman for the Ashland Iron & Steel company, who has been here hiring men and teams, says the company is getting out 50,000 cords of wood for the charcoal retorts. Of this, 30,000 cords come from Blueberry, 25,000 cords from Hinckley and 20,000 cords from Dunham and other points.

## LOSS ON CAPITOL A HALF MILLION

FLAMES UNDER CONTROL EARLY LAST EVENING.

Lighted Candle in a Room Containing Paints and Oil Responsible for the Damage—Legislature Will Probably Adjourn Until a Suitable Meeting Place Can Be Provided—State Will Soon Commence the Work of Repairs.

Des Moines, Iowa, Jan. 5.—Iowa's beautiful \$3,000,000 capitol building bedecked for the reception of the thirtieth general assembly, which convened next Monday, sustained a \$500,000 fire loss yesterday. Governor Cummins and other officials were dazed at the disastrous work of the fire, and for a time the statehouse was given up as doomed.

At 5 o'clock last evening the fire was controlled after completely gutting the north wing. The fire was carried by oils in magnificent paintings and expensive fresco work thru the corridors and draperies. With less than a sixty-pound water pressure the firemen were powerless to cope with the flames.

Workmen left a lighted candle in a room where paints and oils had been stored by the gang of men repairing and altering the building. Just how the blaze was communicated to the paints and oils will perhaps never be known. Samuel Addington, in charge of the painters, charged the fire on Monday morning. A great cloud of smoke enveloped him as he opened the door. He gave the alarm at once. In fifteen minutes the fire had spread thru the entire chamber and was being rapidly communicated thru the walls to all parts of the building. The north wing, containing the house chamber and committee rooms, is a complete wreck.

Many touching scenes marked the progress of the fire. A delegation of old soldiers called upon Governor Cummins at 3 o'clock. "We must have our flags," said one of the old soldiers. "They are safe," said the governor. "I passed them just a minute ago." In vain the police tried to keep back the veterans, who crowded the building and gathered in front of the auditorium. The firemen were unable to get into the building.
