

Norton was charged in police court this morning on a charge of forgery. He pleaded guilty and was bound to the grand jury in \$500 bonds.

STIRRING OPERA "BARON HUMBURG"

TO BE GIVEN BY ROOSEVELT CLUB NEXT MONTH.

It Abounds in Laughable Dialog, Has a Good Plot, and Is Full of Good Songs, Catchy and Excellent, From a Purely Musical Standpoint—Club Is Equal to It, Too.

Without exception the best opera that has been seen in the northwest this season will be "Baron Humburg," which will be given at the Metropolitan theater by the Roosevelt club of Minneapolis next month. This is not saying that the opera will be better presented than some of the other musical productions in the city this season, but it is a fact that the dialog is better, the plot more interesting, and the musical numbers are superior to any that have come this way. "Baron Humburg" is especially strong in its musical selections. In all there are twenty-seven numbers, and every one of these is new and of real merit. Unlike most of the operas in this day of musical comedies, the music is varied enough not to become uninteresting. The compositions vary from the wildest Hungarian airs to the simplest ballads and the catchiest topical songs. Two of the gems of the opera, "The Land of the Whispering Sea," and "Well, Well, Why You Fool," will be sung by Hal Stevens and J. W. Geary. Mr. Stevens will also be heard to advantage in "The Waters of the Danube Blue" and he will be ably supported by the Gypsy band. The chorus was elected by the play committee for the voices, and is composed of a number of the best local singers. Mr. Geary, the club's new tenor, has several pretty selections, perhaps the most tuneful being "Sylvia," a little love ballad, which he sings with the aid of the orchestra. "Sylvia" is a chorus lacks in voice it makes up in size, for there is not a member in it less than six feet in height. In addition to the vocal numbers, the Gypsy band will play some of the best songs of the Gypsy band. 
