TOILS TIGHTEN 'ROUND VAJGA

WATCH OF MURDERED MAN FOUND UPON THE PRISONER.

Blood Spots on His Clothing Will Be Analyzed—Arrest Made at Grand Forks and Identification Established on Return to Great Falls—Actual Eye Witness to the Crime Lacking.

Special to The Journal. Great Falls, Minn., Feb. 25.—Sheriff Bonner has returned to Great Falls from Grand Forks, N. D., bringing with him George Hlobika, alias Vajga, accused of the murder of George Sedlacek on the train from Sand Coulee to Stockton on Feb. 17.

Immediately upon his arrival the prisoner was identified by Deputy Sheriff Thompson as the man who was last seen with the murdered man and in less than two hours later he was further identified by Thomas Heller of Stockton and by Ed Frieder of Sand Coulee.

The chain of circumstantial evidence against Vajga has been greatly strengthened and there is now nothing lacking but an actual eye witness to place the noose about his neck.

Until his arrival in Great Falls Hlobika denied absolutely to Sheriff Bonner that he had ever been in Sand Coulee altho he admitted having been in Great Falls, but when Deputy Sheriff Thompson stepped toward him he at once recognized the officer and admitted that he had spent some time at Sand Coulee and had known George Sedlacek.

On one of the shirts worn by Hlobika there are several large spots of blood which will be analyzed to determine whether or not they are of human blood. Sheriff Bonner also took from the prisoner a silver watch which has been identified as the property of the murdered man.

ASKS MONEY FOR COLONY

SALVATION ARMY COMMANDER APPROACHES CONGRESS WITH NEW ZEALAND PLAN.

Washington, Feb. 25.—Commander Booth-Tucker of the Salvation Army is here seeking to interest senators and representatives in a colonization plan. He proposes the creation, under the interior department, of a colonization bureau, with a chief drawing a salary of \$6,000 a year, supported by the issue of \$20,000,000 3 per cent gold government bonds. Under the bill, Mr. Tucker has prepared, to those settling on homesteads reclaimed by irrigation in the arid regions may be granted loans not exceeding \$1,500 each, secured on homesteads.

Accompanying the bill is a memorial showing the system now being utilized in New Zealand. Colonization has been effective there for eight years. The structure with \$1,000,000 has been loaned, without a dollar of loss. Commander Tucker had interested Senator Hanna in his plan, and the bill was to have been introduced by him.

EXPLOSION KILLS THREE

WARNER STARCH MILL AND CONTENTS, VALUED AT \$250,000, A TOTAL LOSS.

Chicago, Feb. 25.—Three men were killed and eighteen injured in an explosion which destroyed the starch mill of the Warner Sugar Refining company at Waukegan, Ill. It will be at least a fortnight before the wreckage can be cleaned up so that the mill can be started. There are no more bodies in the debris. The mill was a brick building four stories high, 200 feet long by 100 feet wide. The structure with the machinery it contained was valued at \$250,000. The building and all it contained is a total loss.

SETTLERS IN HARD LINES

'OVERLAP LANDS' AWARDED THE NORTHERN PACIFIC—TWO THOUSAND HOLDERS AFFECTED.

Vancouver, Wash., Feb. 25.—The recent decision of the supreme court of the United States in awarding the "overlap lands" to the Northern Pacific railway will affect almost 2,000 persons in this country.

The contest grants comprise all the odd sections in the northern and western portions of Clark county, and of them being fine timber, grazing and farm lands. On this land the government has issued 1,895 patents and many of the patentees have made their homes there for years and improved the property.

The suit has been bitterly fought thru the courts for ten years and thousands of dollars have been expended to defray the costs. Should it be impossible to make the railroad company select other lands under the lien law act, the settlers must suffer the hardship of buying their land over again from the company or forfeit their farms and improvements.

TRAMPS' FIRE KILLS TWO

WOMAN HAS TO JUMP FROM LODGING-HOUSE—MUCH DAMAGE DONE.

Colorado Springs, Col., Feb. 25.—Two lives were lost in a fire that broke out at 1 o'clock this morning and threatened the entire business section. The dead are: Lela Smith, a 15-year-old girl, and an unknown man.

The girl perished in her room at a lodging-house, from which her mother escaped only by jumping. The remains of the man were found in the debris lodged between the timbers of two burned buildings.

Ten thousand dollars will probably cover the property loss. Three horses and three others had to be shot. The fire is supposed to have been started by tramps striking matches in a lively stable.

SAN DOMINGO PORTS OPEN

Blockade Is Ineffective—Government Forces Recapture Two Places.

San Domingo, Feb. 25.—The towns of San Cristobal and Baní have been recaptured by forces from the government garrison. Another government force has been sent to attack the insurgents at San Pedro de Macoris.

United States Minister Powell has notified the government that Washington does not recognize the closing of ports nor the present possession of the government. The blockade is ineffective. The insurgents inflicted great damages to property in the vicinity of this city, but the town of San Carlos has been almost completely destroyed.

Cincinnati—Mrs. Caroline M. Lee, aged 77 years, widow of the late Rev. Thomas Lee, who was known as the mother of Methodism, is dead.

Chicago—President Van B. Harper of the University of Chicago has suffered a relapse of his recent attack of appendicitis, and again is under the attention of his physicians.

Seattle—A special from Dawson says that Count and Countess Morawski are in Some in jail, charged with attempting to murder Captain William Gildea, a former friend. Their bonds are fixed at \$50,000.

Cincinnati—Ohio—Fire today practically wiped out the business portion of Cincinnati harbor, burning the Mutual block, the Marine Bank building, the postoffice and several stores. Loss estimated at \$100,000.

New York—Cattolich is rapidly advancing in price, owing to the war in the far east. About a week ago it was 77 cents a pound by the barrel. It is now 85 cents and is said to be extremely scarce even at that figure.

New York—Master bakers of the west side have decided to advance the price of rolls from 10 to 12 cents a dozen, owing to the high prices prevailing for wheat and flour. Many bakers here refused the size of their loaves but no action has been taken towards raising the price of bread.
