


NEWS ITEMS SHOULD BE IN BY THURSDAY OF EACH WEEK

WHY THE JAPANESE WERE READY FOR THE WAR

They Foresaw the Inevitable Conflict and Never Ceased to Prepare for It - Cramps' Shipyard People Tell How Well They Handled Their New Boats - Some Fine Gunnery Shown. Philadelphia, Feb. 25. - Captain George F. Wilde, who succeeded Rear Admiral Charles S.
