SAYS FAULT IS PEOPLE'S

GRAND JURY SAYS MAJORITY DON'T WANT GAMBLING AND SOCIAL-EVIL LAWS RIGIDLY ENFORCED.

Do the people want the laws relating to gambling and the social evil enforced? The grand jury's answer, in its final report, filed late yesterday, is in the negative. A majority do not want the city council to pass laws regulating the evils, laws that can and will be enforced. If the council has not the power to pass such laws, it is recommended that the legislature should be petitioned to give it such power.

An appropriation for improvements upon the city workhouse is recommended. The poor farm is reported to be in excellent condition and Superintendent Colburn is highly complimented upon his efficiency, and the charges made against him are dismissed as entirely unfounded. Other institutions are reported to be in good condition.
