WOMEN WRITE PLATFORM

New Sharon to Make Its Campaign on Lines Suggested by Women.

Marshalltown, Iowa, March 18.—The town of New Sharon is having a unique experience in municipal politics, the campaign for city offices being conducted upon the part of the citizens' ticket on a platform written by the women of the town. It happened this way:

The women interested themselves in the city government and at a meeting drew up a petition which was signed by forty-four of the best known ladies in the village. The petition was in the nature of an appeal to the voters to put aside party and personal preference in the interest of candidates who would give the town the best possible government from a moral and legal standpoint. Then a citizens' caucus was called and after the nominations were made the petition of the women was formally adopted as the platform upon which the campaign would be made. There

is no doubt that the ticket will be elected. Heretofore there has always been a lively fight for the positions of mayor and councilmen, but it is believed there will be an overwhelming defeat of any one who dares to oppose the women's ticket. C. A. Swisher was nominated for mayor and T. H. Osborne, George Barbour and J. W. Irwin for councilmen. Following is the appeal of the women:

To the voters of New Sharon: We, the undersigned ladies of New Sharon, respectfully ask you in the coming city election to lay aside all personal and party preference and vote only for such men as will give us the best possible government from a legal and moral standpoint. We ask it in the interest of our children and the people of this town who will soon take our places in its government, and for whose fitness for the trust you will be largely responsible.

A RODIN MONOGRAPH

Great French Sculptor Developed His Genius in the Hard School of Life. The Craftsman for March is full of meaty articles touching many and important phases of art in its widest sense. The leading article on Auguste Rodin has a breadth and seriousness worthy of its subject. It is the work of two of the sculptor's patriots, Jean Schopfer and Claude Anet, and is translated by Irene Sargent. The illustrations number nearly a score and make it a monograph worthy of preservation. The fact is noted that Rodin had little academic instruction, and for this reason the highest development is capable of recognizing its own in the past. And then, for its development, it has the hard school of life, the best one that exists. It is thru struggle that a distinctive personality establishes itself and becomes conscious of its own powers.

Of the utmost importance are the ideas set forth by Frederick S. Lamb, president of the New York Architectural League, on "Commercial Value of Design," in which he points out the need of conditions that will produce the maximum of value for every ounce of material and for this reason the highest development of design must be appreciated, taught and applied.
