Turners, Tasmos or Acmes Expected to Get First Money in State Bowling Tourney—Hansen and Parker of Minneapolis Are High in the Doubles to Date.

From present indications, either the Tasmos or Turners of Minneapolis or the Acmes of St. Paul will take first place in the state bowling tournament now in progress at the Co-operative alleys. At the close of last night's play for five-man teams, the score of 2,894 made by the Capitals of St. Paul was still high for the tournament. This is considered a comparatively easy mark for the three teams named to shoot at, and to-night's games, when the quintets roll, promise to be the most sensational of the match. The Buffaloes last night bade fair to pass the Capitals, and but for some very bad luck in the first game, would have put the high total away over 2,700. They got only 785 for the first game, but came back in the second and made 957, following this with 950 and finishing with a total only two pins behind the Capitals. The bison are now second in the race, with 2,692, the Chris team of Minneapolis third, 2,691; the Victorias of St. Paul fourth, 2,687; the Nicollets of Minneapolis fifth, 2,613, and the Courts, St. Paul, sixth, 2,609. The Victorias have high score for one game, with 985 in the tournament, the mark set by the Chris team Monday.

day night. The Nicollets did not come up to the expectations of their friends last night. They had bad luck in splits and several members of the team blew easy spares time and again.

In the two-man team contest, Minneapolis has taken the lead. Hansen and Parker of the Tuxedos last night went away over the record for the first evening, making a total of 1,174. This, however, is not likely to stand, with such teams as Harland and Olinnes, Nuehler and Hughes, Farr and Mueller, Fillmore and Sloan, Budinger and Parker, Finska and Hinderer are third, with 1,113, and Carter and Brown fourth, with 1,097. Schmidt, up to date, has high score, with 283—a mark that is quite likely to stand for the tournament. Schmidt also has high average for six games to date, with 206 1-3. Hinderer of St. Paul has an average of 196.

To-night's games promise to be exciting. In the five-man team contest the Turners and Tasmos, and crack Minneapolis league teams, will roll on adjacent alleys at 8 p. m. These teams are counted on to win first and, perhaps, second place for Minneapolis. The Acmes of St. Paul last year's state champions, also will make strong bid for the money. A number of strong bowlers will roll in the doubles and singles also.

The attendance last night was larger than the night before, and President Fowler of the state association announced that the gate receipts and entrance fees already amounted to more than the prize money and expenses. If the receipts continue as large to-night and to-morrow night, additional prize money will be hung up.
