TOBREAK GAMBLING TRUST

CHARLEY LOOMIS TRIES TO BLOCK THE ADMINISTRATION PLANS FOR RESTRICTED GAMES.

C. I. Loomis, proprietor of a gambling-house at 251 First avenue S, whose place was raided Saturday night, is likely to interfere with the administration plans for restricted gambling. His place was raided Saturday and now he threatens to go after the "authorized" gamblers. Several weeks ago, in compliance with an order that gambling-houses should not be conducted in rooms over saloons, Loomis secured rooms at 251 First avenue S but was at once notified to close. Seeing other gambling-houses running, he opened his place late last week and was raided. When arraigned in police court this morning, William Landor, the man found

in charge by the police, entered a plea of not guilty and his attorney, E. F. Waite, asked a continuance until next Friday.

Police Superintendent Conroy says that he has nothing personal against Loomis, but that complaints were received against the place and that Loomis refused to comply with administration orders.

THE BAUER RECITAL

The Harold Bauer piano recital given at the First Baptist church Saturday evening attracted a large audience considering the flood of musical attractions which has deluged the city for the past two weeks. Almost all of the musicians, however, were present and although the audience was inclined to be cold and apathetic, the fine playing of the artist, his admirable poise and balance, and his magnificent tone acted like a charm upon the seated listeners, and secured for the artist worthy recognition and insistent recalls. The program was well calculated to display Bauer's virtuosity in all its phases. The Beethoven "Sonata in A flat op. 11," was given with exquisite clearness and

beautiful intonation. The Schumann "Fantasia in C major" was given a heroic rendering with octavo work that was marvelous in its perfection. Chopin, whose music is not usually reckoned as particularly suited to Bauer's accomplishments, was simply ideal. The Nocturne in E was limpid in its beauty and the ballads were lovely and expressive. The last group on the program was especially interesting. The Gluck "Gavotte," arranged by Brahms was played daintily. The Alkan "Etude in E minor," a novelty here, is a brilliant piano number and was given a splendid rendering. The "Ride of the Valkyries" by Wagner was the piece de resistance and its colossal demands on the technique of the performer were more than amply met. Bauer is always grateful to the listener, always satisfactory, and never more so than on this occasion. —Howard Boardman.

SAVAGE SACRED CONCERT

The sacred concert of the Savage English Opera company given last evening was even better than that given a week ago, and that is saying much. The first part of the program was Gounod's "St. Cecilia Mass," with Miss Rennyson, Mr. Sheehan and Mr. Goff as the soloists. It was a fine rendering, each of the soloists being heartily received. Mr. Sheehan sang the "Sanctus" beautifully and received two recalls. Miss Rennyson was also

encored for her singing of the "Benedictus." The best ensemble work was in the "Gloria" in which Mr. Emanuel, the director, secured some fine choral and orchestral effects. Mr. Goff, after singing with his usual taste and effect, seemed somewhat less at ease than the other soloists. The orchestra was not as fully responsive as it might have been, a lack of adequate rehearsal being apparent.

The second part of the program opened with a Liszt "Hungarian Rhapsody" by

the orchestra, which was repeatedly encored in spite of ragged playing and ineffectual directing. Miss Newman sang a selection requiring much coloratura cilia Mass," with Miss Rennyson, Mr. work, with fine effect. She has a sweet and well trained mezzo-soprano voice and her vocal pyrotechnics, tho not dazzling, were thoroughly enjoyable. Mr. Boyle's interpretation of the bass "Cavatina" from "La Juive," was magnificent and he was enthusiastically recalled. Mr. Sheehan's rendition of the "Friso Song" from "Die Meistersinger," was a glorious effort. His encore was the "Lost Chord." Mr. Goff sang an aria from Verdi's "Un Ballo in Maschera," and quite carried off the honors of the evening. His fine voice and immense range are a constant surprise and delight. Miss Brooks sang "The Lord Is My Light," with good taste, but with a marked vibrato that marred the effect.

The concert closed with Donizetti's perennial "Sextet" from "Lucia," by Misses Farn and Le Brun and Messrs. Sheehan, Fulton, Lawrence and Bennett, with orchestral accompaniment. The inade-

quacy of the women's voices prevented the full measure of success which ought to attend the rendition of this famous dramatic number. —Howard Boardman.
