CITY NEWS. THEATERS OBJECT TO SPRINKLERS

MANAGERS STATE CASE BEFORE COUNCIL COMMITTEE.

Fire Chief insists that they are necessary to safety—Committee, Unable to Decide, Defers Action Until Friday—Revolving-Door Clause Allowed to Stand.

Decided objections to sprinkler systems on theater stages were made today by the representatives of the local theaters at the meeting of the city council's special committee on theater building ordinance. Although sprinkler equipments were advocated by Fire Chief James R. Canterbury and by Building Inspector James G. Houghton, the five aldermen present could come to no agreement, and after two hours of talk, adjourned to meet next Friday at 9 a. m. It is understood that the committee will present a theater ordinance to the council meeting next Friday evening.

The theatrical representatives argued that their houses were perfectly safe without the sprinklers, as the stages were enclosed in fireproof walls, had asbestos curtains, ventilating shafts, standpipes and portable extinguishers. Mr. Canterbury insisted that it would be possible for fires to break out when it was not necessary, while the "dry" systems could not be installed, as they were too heavy for the present roofs to carry.

The clause in the ordinance requiring that ordinary doors be provided on each side of revolving doors in department stores and office buildings was retained, although some objection was made. It was shown, however, that in the event of a fire or a panic from any cause, the revolving doors would be quickly blocked.

I. W. GEORGE, DIVER

Little Joke That Didn't Please a Fair-Viewite.

I. W. George, whose summer home is at Fairview, Lake Minnetonka, has gained fame as a professional diver and has had the benefit of a good deal of advertising at Minnetonka during his absence this winter in California. When he returned to his lake home, the first thing he saw was the sign which had been put up on the wall of his house, and showing a diver, surrounded with the paraphernalia of his profession, and announcing that "Professional George was open to engagements in high and low diving; in ducking and rescuing maidens and in piloting steamers." The wrath of Mr. George was vast and the sign quickly disappeared.

It seems that one evening last summer, while he was carelessly standing on the edge of the dock in front of the pavilion of his neighbor, dressed in yachting costume and admiring the beauty of a dying moon, he lost consciousness of his surroundings, stepped off the dock and fell into the water.
