BODY HAD BEEN CUT UP BY M. D.'S SAYS SPIRITS DREW CURTAINS

MONROE'S REMAINS RECEIVED IN SHOCKING CONDITION.

He Died at the St. Peter Asylum and His Wife Says Her Consent Was Not Asked by the Medics Who Performed an Autopsy.

To have the dead body of one's dearest relative literally cut to pieces in the interest of science at a state institution is the experience of Mrs. Joseph Monroe, 36 University avenue SE.

Mrs. Monroe is heartbroken over the matter, and thinks that she has been inhumanly imposed upon by the physicians at the St. Peter asylum, who sent back the body in such a condition that it was recognized with difficulty.

Joseph Monroe was sent to St. Peter from the Minneapolis city hospital about Oct. 1, 1902. He was suffering from an incurable dementia, and after he was admitted there he fell and broke his hip.

After this plea had been entered, Victor Wiese, who at the last meeting of the village council had been retained as village counsel, moved to quash the charge on account of a faulty complaint.

The saloonkeeper had been arrested on the charge of not having his curtains drawn back from the front windows of his saloon on Sundays.

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
