"How do you feel over the prospect that you may become president of the United States? Do you think you can manage such a big job?" "I have no doubt of it," replied Justice Parker.

"I am elected, I believe I can fill the job. I may not know all about it now, but I can learn it. They are men from whom one may learn a great deal about the presidency before taking the office, and the rest will come after one gets in. I feel about the matter as you do."


STRUGGLE FOR A METEOR.
