TWO HUNDRED MEN AND MANY DRILLS

CANISTEO COMPANY FINDS LARGE ORE BODIES.

Most Important Mineral Development Now in Progress in the Lake Superior Region—Millions of Tons Proved Up—Important Experiments with New Methods of Concentration.

Duluth, Minn., June 4.—The most important mineral development on the iron range now in progress is the exploration of the Canisteo mine, company, west of Duluth, in township 56, range 24.

The company is sinking two large shafts and has already spent a fortune in its explorations. The Canisteo company has found the largest of iron ore bodies in the immediate vicinity of Trout lake, Itasca county, in sections 29, 30, 31 and 32.

Another large group of properties has been located in sections 20, 21 and 22, same town, and explorations have been carried on still further east with favorable results.

How Concentrated.

Concentration of these sandy ore will be damp agitation in fitted barrel screen, the final apertures of which will vary from as fine as forty mesh to much coarser, according to the character of the ore.

The company is sinking two three-compartment shafts, one in section 30, and one in 21, on what is known as the Holman.

A most interesting shipment of iron ore has just been made. It was a cargo of Mesaba, Albany grade, guaranteed 60 iron and .077 phosphorus.

ORE FOR CAPE BRETON.

A considerable amount of Mesaba and western Lake Superior ore has been sold this year for tidewater.

Butte, Mont., June 4.—An unknown man was shot and instantly killed by Frank W. Ironside, a bartender, at 1 o'clock this morning while the former, it is asserted by Ironside, was attempting to hold him up.

From Ironside's story it appears that the unknown man was intoxicated and was attempting to show off before two friends with whom he had been drinking by searing Ironside with a hot iron.

After some play of this kind Ironside was ordered to go behind the bar and treat without wasting any time, the unknown man telling him with a curse that he believed he would hold him up.

Ironside, while serving drinks, seized another revolver lying beneath the bar and quickly fired, the bullet striking the stranger behind the neck.

THE BODY IS THAT OF A MAN ABOUT 30, well dressed, wearing an air of refinement. Ironside is under arrest. He declares he took the precaution of placing several revolvers under his bar because of fear of being robbed by his customers who have been operating extensively in Butte.
