

MINNESOTA MUCH LUMBER

HEAVY SHIPMENTS FROM DULUTH AND TWO HARBORS.

Letter Point Is Forwarding More Stock Than in Any Previous Year—Sales Are Dull, However, The Lumbermen Report More Active Inquiry Than for Some Time.

Duluth, Minn., June 17.—Lumber shipments are very heavy, both from Duluth and Two Harbors. At the latter point more lumber has been sent forward than in any previous year for the same length of time. Here single commission firms have shipped more than 18,000,000 feet already. One firm has had twenty-seven boats at the docks. The steamer Myron and two barges loaded 3,000,000 feet between Saturday morning and Monday night, with no work on Sunday. They were all at one dock, and the reason is a good one. The ships have left Two Harbors this week with lumber, and there is at least one vessel at the Northern Pacific docks all the time loading Crocker stock.

The new planing mill of the Virginia Lumber company has been completed and is about ready for operation. It is a very complete plant, and will add much to the number of men working about the company's buildings. James G. Ketchum, formerly of the Tower Lumber company, and now manager here for the American Lumber company, has become sales manager of the Virginia Lumber company, with offices at Duluth, and has already entered upon his duties. Logging business of Alger, Smith & Co. has been cut to summer schedule, and about sixty cars a day is the average product.

There is nothing in the rumor that the business of the W. T. Baller Lumber company has been sold to the Weyerhaeuser interests. There have been a few sales of lumber this week, one lot of about 1,000,000 feet off the St. Louis docks; another of about the same amount from the Red Cliff, and several others. Lumbermen report a more active inquiry than for some time, and they expect to make some additional sales this week. But business is dull, as a rule, and lumber is not selling as freely as hoped for.

FERGUS FALLS, MINN.—The Robison-Gamble Commission company of Minneapolis, Braden & Metcalf of Duluth, and the American Lumber Co. and McDonald Brothers of Minneapolis, and the Minnesota Lumber Co. of Duluth, have petitioned in the federal court here asking that M. J. Hogan & Son, merchants of New Fayetteville, be adjudged bankrupt. The petition alleges that the firm gave a trust deed to Christian Grunwald for the benefit of the creditors of the firm, and that it has failed to pay the debt of \$3,000, and that some of the creditors who did not join in the trust deed are now bringing suit with a view to securing preference in their claims over those who did.
