REVENUES AFTER BANKERS | CAR CATCHES FIRE

HANDLING OF WHISKY CERTIFICATES HELD TO NECESSITATE THE TAKING OUT OF LIQUOR LICENSES

Revenue officers are investigating a phase of banking which interests Minneapolis banks and which developed in Boston. As the result of an investigation begun by Judge W. H. Emerson, chief of the Boston police board, the national banks of that city may be required to take out wholesale liquor licenses. These banks, which are prohibited from selling liquor as security on loans, and if the obligations are not met sell the certificates to liquor dealers.

"These certificates," said Judge Emerson, "are worth so many barrels of whisky, and in my opinion the national banks which sell them violate the liquor law."
