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FIRST WOMAN IN THE ENGLISH MINISTRY

Miss Gertrude von Petzold, who has recently been elected pastor of a Unitarian church in Leicester, is the pioneer in the Religious Field.

The appointment of a woman to the ministry in England is a historic event. The first woman to be accepted in this profession is Miss Gertrude von Petzold.

She was elected pastor of the Unitarian Free church of Leicester. The Oxford Chronicle gives the following sketch of this young woman:

"Miss von Petzold, who is 23 years of age, is of striking appearance and charming manner. A native of Thorn, West Prussia, she is of noble descent on both sides, her mother being a Von Wedel-schlag and her father a captain in the Prussian army."

"In an interview Miss von Petzold said she obtained her early education from a governess. In conjunction with her two elder sisters, she attended a high-class school at Stettin. There, after four years' study, she passed the higher government teachers' examination, which was at that time the only examination open to girls in Germany."

An academic career being closed to German girls, she went to England to complete her education, studying two years at the University of St. Andrews; two years at Edinburgh university, where she took her master's degree with classical honors, and studying theology three years at Oxford. She has also attended theological and philosophical lectures at Berlin.

Miss von Petzold was brought up in the Lutheran faith, but became dissatisfied with it, and her study of the Bible brought her into the more liberal church. Her aim in life is to study and search for the truths of religion.
