Frontier Town Retains Filing Office Only on Promise of Good Behavior.

D., July 26.—After determined action and united pleading upon the part of citizens, Clerk McPhaul, who was in charge of the registration of voters, has finally agreed to hand a favorable report to Commissioner Richards and to recommend that the filing office be retained here, as first planned. Mr. McPhaul had determined to request that the office be moved to Fairfax. Many concessionaires had torn up and were ready to move out of town. The assurance from McPhaul has put them back.
 "If I am not positively assured that law will reign," he told them, "this office moves."

FIND DEAD MEN'S HATS

Bodies of Drowned Miners at Butte Will Be Recovered.

 Butte, Mont., July 26.—Three shifts of men worked all day yesterday and last night at the Belmont tanking out the water in an effort to recover the bodies of Victor Catalina, John Murphy and Ferdinand Franklin, miners who lost their lives Sunday afternoon when the mine was suddenly flooded on account of a bulkhead giving way on the 200-foot level in a crosscut leading to chambers mine, which was full of water.
 About 8 o'clock last evening the hats of the three men were brought up in the tank. The water at that time had been lowered to the 800-foot level and it was estimated that at the rate the water was going down the bodies would be reached on the 900-foot level some time today.

FIRE AT TWO HARBORS

Loss on the Car Shops of Duluth & Iron Range Is \$75,000.

 Two Harbors, Minn., July 26.—A fire which started at 4:30 this morning destroyed the car shops and their contents of the Duluth & Iron Range Railroad company, entailing a loss of about \$75,000, covered by insurance.
 The fire started in the pattern department from an unknown cause and spread rapidly among the dry material through the building. It was kept under control and prevented from spreading to the machine shops, boilerhouse and storehouse close by. All the car records of the road were destroyed, together with the tools owned by its workmen, the latter being a total loss to the employees.
 The building was about one hundred feet wide and about two hundred long and one story high. Of late years it has proved inadequate to the demands of the road, and prospects are bright that work will be commenced on rebuilding on a much larger scale at once.
