



**FIND SITE OF LE SUEUR'S OLD FORT**

BUILT IN 1700 BY THE INTREPID EXPLORER.

State Historical Society Men Locate the Ground Described in Writings of Le Sueur, but Find No Relics of Any Kind—Excavations Noted Before Land Was Cultivated.

Mankato, Minn., Sept. 27.—Judge Lorin Gray of the district court, General J. H. Baker and Thomas Hughes of the State Historical society and Professor U. O. Cox of the state normal school made a successful search for the location of the fort that was built three miles from the mouth of the Blue Earth river in 1700 by Le Sueur and his party of thirty men, who came up the Mississippi and Minnesota rivers by boat in search of the copper mines that was said to exist in this vicinity. The writings of Le Sueur and others of the party are still preserved, and from them the location of the fort, and also of the mine, was traced.

The fort was found to have been built on a rather high eminence on a large mound where the Le Sueur river flows into the Blue Earth river three miles from Mankato. This land is now under cultivation, but before it was cultivated some excavations were noticed. There is also a fine spring of water flowing out of the top of the mound, and its source is a mystery, as the surrounding country is no higher. It was here that the wooden fort was constructed, and 400 buffalo were killed for the winter's food supply.

**TWO AFTER THE REWARD**

NORTHERN PACIFIC SUED BY CLAIMANTS OF PRIZE OFFERED FOR ARREST OF TRAIN ROBBERS.

Helena, Mont., Sept. 27.—Two suits have been entered in the district court against the Northern Pacific Railway company by claimants for the rewards of \$2,000 offered for the arrest and conviction of the men who held up and robbed a train at Bearmouth last June, and for which crime John Christie and George Hammond pleaded guilty at Phillipsburg and were sentenced to seven and fifteen years, respectively.

Henry J. Stubbs of Wilmington, Del., has also entered a suit against the Yellowstone Park Transportation company, claiming damages of \$15,000 because of alleged injuries received in the upsetting of a park coach last August.

The federal jury has returned indictments against ex-Mayor Frank Edwards, ex-Chief of Police Thomas Travis and Sam Goheen, charged with the degree assault upon George C. Freeman, receiver of the government land-office in this city one day last week. Their bonds were fixed at \$300 and furnished. This outcome came as a great surprise.

Freeman's office was visited by the men in question to demand the authority of the state regarding the land had "grafted" a gamblinghouse for \$7,500. Freeman refused to disclose the name of the author, whereupon he alleges that he was arrested by Edwards, Travis and Goodman.

**LOGGING OUTFITS SEIZED**

EXTREME MEASURES TAKEN BY BRITISH COLUMBIA TIMBER SURVEYOR TO STOP LOG SMUGGLING.

C., Sept. 27.—John Murray, British Columbia timber surveyor, has seized the entire logging outfit of the Monarch Lumber company and the Erie Mill company, pending an investigation into a charge that these companies have been shipping logs to Blaine, Wash., without paying the provincial export tax or royalty for the past six months. The smuggled logs amounting to several million feet. The value of the seizure is about \$100,000.
